Brief Project Description:

OP&I was contracted by CRC through an RPF for a 2-step process: Step 1 to site assess their existing space & FF&E on Lansdowne Ave and determine a Go/no go to proceed with Step 1 or move to Step 2 in relocating to new space or building a new building. Either outcome involved starting from developing a space needs assessment through to construction documents.

Scope of Services: From Oct 2014 to April 2015, OP&I inventoried the existing FF&E, measured the existing space, met with user groups & Steering Committee to develop space needs assessment, determine working space relationships/ adjacencies, growth, etc. with this programming and block planning it was determined with CRC that relocation was the best solution. In July 2015 OP&I visited various sites with CRC to help determine their relocation to Loch Lomand Place in November 2015, to a portion of a former call center that still contained 95% of the former tenants FF&E. From February to May 2016 OP&I presented total of 5 spaces plans to the Steering Committee. Working with the existing CRC FF&E and Loch Lomond's FF&E, Concept layouts were created and presented to a Steering Committee to achieve the final layout. In July 2016 the final layout and FF&E were developed into 3 Furniture Move plans (existing Lansdowne & Loch Lomond and new Loch Lomond layout) and develop Construction drawings in coordination with CRC Project Manager who in



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> turn was working with CRC's selected contractor to construct the tenant fitup. As a not-for-profit organization it was CRC's goal and OP&I's challenge to reuse as much as possible the existing; furniture from the 2 locations, walls & acoustic T Bar ceiling and lighting in the new location, while creating a space that was new, fresh and functional and reflected who CRC was and improve workflow. The minimal impact to Mechanical and Electrical was handled through CRC and selected contractor.

Project Documents consisted of Facility Planning & Design Brief (132 pages), Existing Space Floor & FF&E Plans, Space Metrics and Room Data Sheets, Space Planning, Concept Designs, FF&E Move Plans for both existing Lansdowne & Loch Lomand and new Loch Lomand layout, Construction Documents consisting of Composite Plan, Demolition Plan, Construction Plan, Reflected Ceiling Plan, Floor & Wall Finishes Plans (Spec on drawings).
